URBAN + REGIONAL PLANNING PROGRAM FACULTY POSITION IN REAL ESTATE DEVELOPMENT

The Urban + Regional Planning Program intends to make a faculty appointment to begin in academic year 2009/2010 in **real estate development**. For this position, we seek applicants to teach and conduct research in real estate analysis and development and to provide leadership for the University of Michigan Real Estate Program.

International planning interests and/or expertise in urban design are assets to the position. Applicants should hold a Ph.D. in urban planning, business administration, or related fields, or should hold a terminal professional degree in urban planning, urban design, architecture, business administration, or related fields, together with a record of recognition for their scholarly and/or creative work. Positions may be filled at junior or senior levels in either the tenure track or the professionally based Professor of Practice track, depending on applicants' qualifications and backgrounds. An ability to contribute to two or more urban and regional planning concentrations is desirable. Similarly, the capacity to contribute to multiple programs across Taubman College is an advantage. Taubman College offers professional degrees in urban planning, architecture, and urban design as well as the Ph.D. in urban planning and in architecture.
